I did some bad things to everyone including her. She forgave me right away. Told me that was between me and the lord and she loved me no matter what. I'll never forget how happy she was the last time i saw her and i looked happy and healthy (fat). She had me put her socks on for her like she had done for me a million times before. I offered to brush her hair and make her look "presentable" before she had to see the doctor. She was always worried about what her hair looked like. My grandfather was a great man and i feel like her death was overlooked because his was so soon before hers. She was the one who held us all together. I miss her very much.
