She was a loving and devoted daughter, wife, mother, sister, family member, and friend.

Born in Bogalusa, Louisiana, on January 28, 1950, she graduated from Bogalusa High School and received a Master's Plus 30 degree in Education from Southeastern Louisiana University at Hammond. She enriched the lives of all the students she encountered in her many years of teaching.

She was a member of Pettitt Memorial Baptist Church where she served as organist for many years and also enjoyed giving of her time and energy in other areas as well.
